Therapy in Dublin North Central (Dublin North City Area)

Speech and Language Therapy

The Primary Care Speech and Language Therapy Department in Dublin North Central provides services to children, adults and older persons who present with speech, language, voice, fluency and swallowing difficulties.

Primary Care service for adults:

What do we do?

Speech & Language Therapists in the Adult Speech and Language Therapy Service assess and work with adults with a wide range of communication and swallowing difficulties.

Who do we see?

We see adults (18 years and above), who have communication or swallowing difficulties as their primary need.

We see adults who live in our catchment area of Dublin North City.

We accept referrals for adults with the following needs:

- If you have unclear speech.
- If you difficulty understanding and/or using words and sentences
- Stammering/Stuttering: difficulty with fluent speech (getting stuck on words)
- Voice: hoarseness / loss of voice. (Talk to your G.P. about referral to E.N.T. (Ear, Nose and Throat) Department also), Referral to ENT Department for assessment of your voice box.
- Eating, drinking and swallowing disorders. If you are having difficulty chewing or
 have a sensation that food is lodging in your throat, coughing while eating or drinking
 or if food or drink goes against your breath.

These difficulties can occur with the following:

- Stroke
- Parkinson's Disease
- Multiple Sclerosis

- Motor Neuron Disease
- Huntington's Disease
- Dementia
- Brain tumour
- Brain injury
- Head and Neck Cancer
- Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease
- Pneumonia or recurrent chest infections.

- Accent reduction
- Teaching English as a foreign language
- Elocution

A medical referral is needed if you have difficulty eating, drinking or swallowing, e.g., from a GP, Public Health Nurse, Physiotherapist, Occupational Therapist, etc
