Patient identified as potentially eligible for PRRT	Patient to be referred to the national PRRT Tumour conference for discussion	Treating clinician at patient's local hospital
Patient to be discussed at national PRRT Tumour Conference SVUH and decision made on recommended treatment	National PRRT tumour conference including PRRT centre clinicians and treating clinician, as appropriate, to consider patients and decide if to progress for PRRT. Patient prioritisation matrix used to determine if patient has PRRT in SVUH or via TAS	Treating clinician at patient's local hospital together with PRRT centre clinician
Patient to proceed to PRRT¹ at SVUH or the Treatment Abroad Scheme (TAS) (as capacity is building in SVUH)	PRRT centre to take over care of patient for duration of PRRT	PRRT centre clinician in conjunction with treating clinician at patient's local hospital and/or patients GP
