Comments and recommendations made by the inspection team as a result of the inspection	Staff are to be congratulated on the work undertaken since the last inspection and we wish you success at the launch of the staff induction programme.  In order to guide practice development in the future the following recommendations are made:  1. Update MRSA policy to reflect best practice in relation to wound care.  2. Ensure that wound measurements are recorded and included on wound charts.  3. While we recognise that an outside company has undertake "Fire Drill/Training", a current list of staff, dates and signatures of when staff attended fire drill and content of the training should be available for inspection.  A similar arrangement should be in place to document all training and a synopsis of the content of the training be available for inspection.  4. Although latex gloves are in use we recommend that lightweight plastic gloves are used in relation to infection control and standard precautions.  5.
