## **Dear Deputy Cullinane,**

NPHET determine the capacity and the public health testing strategy for the HSE. Currently our testing capacity is at 15,000 tests per day which is in line with the original requirement from NPHET. The testing capacity is delivered by 42 acute hospital laboratories and 4 community diagnostic laboratories.

Note in some cases testing capacity can be stood up or down with appropriate notice so the available capacity can fluctuate.

The laboratories have to meet a number of testing demands including:

- Acute hospital In-patient testing
- Health care worker testing
- Targeted public health testing initiatives; such as those in Residential Care Facilities
- Population testing for people who meet the case definition

Please see attachment setting out the volumes undertaken by each laboratory.

While we capture private hospital laboratory results at a cumulative level for public health purposes these tests are not done under the governance of the HSE.
