The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position:

The number of children on waiting lists for Primary Care Assessments	
in Fingal. Figures are based on Dublin 15, Coastal, Balbriggan and Swords	
Community Healthcare Networks (CHN) waiting lists.	Total
Speech Language Therapy (SLT)	778
Physiotherapy	585
Psychology	549
Occupational Therapy (OT)	814

Psychology advice clinics are available within Community Healthcare Organisation Dublin North City and County (CHO DNCC) to provide supports for parents of children on waiting lists for assessments. I have attached the Advice Clinic leaflet which contains relevant information and contact details about the clinics which they should find helpful.

Under the Enhanced Community Care (ECC) Programme, CHO DNCC is benefiting from additional therapy resources which includes recruiting more therapists across disciplines to our service which will help to significantly reduce long waiting times and lists. ECC aims to deliver a health and social care service that meets the needs of our population and its core objective is to shift the majority of care from the acute to the community setting to bring care closer to home for service users
