## Dear Deputy Smith,

I refer to the above Parliamentary Question which has been referred by the Minister for Children; Equality; Disability; Integration and Youth to the Health Service Executive for direct response. I requested the Business Manager in Disability Services to examine the matter and the following outlines the position.

CDNT 3 is currently recruiting therapy assistants and clinicians to their team. Staff will be allocated to provide direct supports to Our Lady of Hope School in Crumlin. Clinical staff are required to support and guide the intervention of therapy assistants. A Physiotherapist is due to start in February and following a period of induction there will be supervision for the Physiotherapy Assistant. A Psychology Assistant has been recruited and supervision is now in place. Additional therapy assistants will be provided to the school as they are recruited and we are also in the process of putting in place supervision for these assistant therapists.

These services will be provided by way of direct intervention and the supports will be provided on a tiered based model of supports as per the PDS model and therefore will not offer supports like IFSP or home based goals in the absence of resources on the teams currently. The responsibility for IFSP/Home Based goals will be provided by the CDNTs in the area.

The services to the school will take on a variety of forms, based on the tired based model of supports as per the PDS model. In order to meet the needs of the school and the individual children and provide input in an evidence informed manner, it will be necessary to identify the needs of the school and the individual children and meet these needs.

In relation to Nursing Supports in the schools. This does not fall under Disabilities as we are not responsible for the nursing support needs of the schools. It may be more appropriate for the Department of Education to reply to the nursing needs for the school.
