Dear Deputy O'Cuív,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

A body of work has taken place to review the Discretionary Payments including the review of guidelines from other jurisdictions along with an audit of dispensing and clinical optometrists in the CHO network. We have established new criteria and remuneration rates, standardised forms and application processes to ensure transparency, consistency and fairness across the region which commenced February 1st, 2024. The process is application based and quantifiable retrospectively.
