PQ Question: To ask the Minister for Health to outline the procedure by which cover is introduced, managed and guaranteed for maternity and other extended leave sought by psychologists and other mental-health practitioners in order to ensure continuity of services and so people on already-long waiting lists do not have to wait even further particularly as management of cover applies to children's care - Réada Cronin.

Dear Deputy Cronin,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

The procedure for seeking approval for a replacement post is set out in the HSE document, Guidance for approval to recruit for Posts in the HSE & Section 38 Agencies.

This procedure applies to all replacements, including maternity leave and other extended leave, e.g. Carer's Leave, Career Break, Sick Leave etc.

Every effort is made to secure replacements in order to minimise impact on our services users. This is achieved in number of ways, preferably by direct employment. In addition, the HSE also has a number of Service Level Agreements with Recruitment agencies for all staff groups, including Consultants, NCHDs, Health and Social Care Professionals and nursing, these are particularly useful for the filling of short-term vacancies. Due to the current labour market shortage of scarce grades e.g. psychology; it is proving more challenging to secure replacements for specific purpose or temporary contracts.
