The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Questions, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and I outline the position as follows;

Primary Care:

The following table details the number of Children and Adults on the Primary Care
Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy waiting list in Laois, how long they have been waiting
and the number of whole-time equivalent staff providing the service.

The PDS model of service delivery is team focussed with functional family goals rather than blocks of intervention with individual disciplines as was the practice in the past. There are now interdisciplinary teams which provide a more integrated model of service delivery. Therefore the Children's Disability Network Teams are no longer keeping waiting lists for separate disciplines within the team.
