"To ask the Minister for Health the number of children currently on the waiting list for hearing examinations in County Roscommon, by length of time waiting, in tabular form; and if he will make a statement on the matter"

Dear Deputy Smith

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position in Primary Care.

New referrals on children are triaged into 3 categories – P1 (known or strongly suspected hearing loss) to be seen within 4 weeks of date of referral; P2 (risk factors for hearing loss) to be seen within 8 weeks of date of referral and R (routine) to be seen within 12 weeks of referral.

Currently we are only able to provide appointments for new referrals triaged as P1 within the 4-6 week time frame due to being severely short-staffed as well as due to lack of appropriate clinical space (we have only one clinical booth in Roscommon which has to be shared for adult and paediatric clinics during the week).



The following table provides the wait times for new and review paediatric clients:
