To ask the Minister for Health if he will confirm that number of single-person GP practices, by county, registered with the GMS; the number of two-person GP practices, by county, registered with the GMS; the number of larger GP practices, by county, registered with the GMS, in tabular form.

Dear Deputy Howlin,

I refer to the above PQ 18605/24 received in our office for response.

I wish to advise that the HSE holds contractual arrangements with the individual GP only. However, many GPs choose to enter into partnership arrangements with their respective GP colleagues within the practice. There are also varying forms of partnership arrangements in place within individual general practices, for instance partnerships may consist of GPs who hold GMS contracts only or alternatively the partnership arrangement may consist of both GMS GPs and those GPs who operate on a private basis within the practice. In addition, not all GPs (GMS or Private) in the practice opt to enter into a partnership arrangement. Consequently, a composite list with details on the breakdown of the number of single handed, two GP Practices and group practices is currently not available.

Please see below number of GMS General Practitioners that are in practice in each county broken down into HSE Area.

The 2023 GP Agreement provides for increased supports and targeted initiatives to GPs to maintain and increase capacity in general practices and also to support and promote partnership arrangements, where feasible.

These measures include enhanced Practice Support Subsidies and introduction of a new form of Practice Grant towards the cost of employing additional practice staff and/or increase in hours of existing practice staff, together with the introduction of a new role of GP Practice Assistant. GPs in group practices are permitted to pool Grants to optimise enhancement of the Practice's capacity. In addition, GPs who are not in a group practice may coalesce for the purposes of availing of enhanced practice capacity.

Targeted initiatives include the provision financial support measures for GPs in rural areas, in particular single-handed GP practices, as well as areas of urban deprivation, where the filling of vacancies have proved challenging to fill. These consists of pilot initiatives whereby qualifying GMS GP practices, where a vacancy has arisen due to the retirement/resignation/death of the outgoing single-handed GP may form an affiliation with a larger practice involving two or more GPs within the nearest population centre, as follows:

- (i) Provision of financial support to larger GMS practices operating within 30kms from the former vacant GMS practice to affiliate/partner and engage an additional GMS GP within a six month period, with a commitment to maintain general practitioner services within the GMS vacancy area.
- (ii) Provision of financial support to larger GMS practices operating within a 25km radius of a qualifying GMS single-handed GP practice to affiliate/partner with the single-handed GMS GP within 5 years of retirement of the single-handed GP, with a commitment to maintain general practitioner services within the area.

I trust this is of assistance.
