**To ask the Minister for Health what structured programme of recurrent funding is needed for the National Stroke Strategy to be implemented; and if he will make a statement on the matter**

Dear Deputy O'Reilly,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in relation to the above parliamentary question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have consulted with the National Clinical Programme (NCP) for Stroke on your question and have been informed that the following outlines the position.

At the time of publication in 2022, the implementation of the National Stroke Strategy 2022-2027, as outlined in Appendix 1 of the Strategy<sup>1</sup>, was costed at €36.5 million cumulative recurring costs.

Please see the table below for the breakdown per pillar. Salary costs were calculated using 2022 pay scales and are subject to change.

Pillar	Cost €
Prevention	5,500,000
Acute Care and Cure	21,211,726
Rehabilitation & Restoration to Living	6,712,900
Education & Research	3,097,543
TOTAL	€36,522,169
