To ask the Minister for Health if plans for the proposed ADHD clinic in the CHO7 area are progressing and the date by which they expect operation to commence.

Dear Deputy,

I refer to the above, I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

The HSE Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS) in Dublin South, Kildare & West Wicklow Community Healthcare (CHO7) currently has a ADHD Service called ADMiRE. ADMiRE is a tertiary referral service that accepts referrals from three Child and Adolescent Mental health service teams in CHO7 these are Ballyfermot, Lucan and Clondalkin. Over the past five years, ADMiRE has developed a structured, standardised and evidence-based clinical pathway for the assessment and management of ADHD. The overarching aim of the ADMiRE clinical pathway is to guide evidence-based healthcare for ADHD, through translation of international guideline recommendations into a structured clinical protocol for the service (Rotter et al. 2019).
