The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the following parliamentary question, which was submitted to this department for response.

**PQ: 32560/24**

*To ask the Minister for Children; Equality; Disability; Integration and Youth the number of children who are on the waiting list for an appointment for the childrens disability network team for speech and language therapy, occupational therapy, psychology, broken down by waiting list timeframes of less than three months, three to six months, six to 12 months and more than 12 months, for CHO6 Wicklow and CHO7 west Wicklow, in tabular form; and if he will make a statement on the matter.*

### **HSE Response**

93 Children's Disability Network Teams (CDNTs) are aligned to 96 Community Healthcare Networks (CHNs) across the country and are providing services and supports for children aged from birth to 18 years of age.

The CDNTs are currently providing services and supports for over 46,000 children and strategies and supports for urgent cases on the waitlist where staffing resources allow. However, there are significant challenges for CDNTs including:

- Significant staffing vacancies
- Growth in numbers of children with complex need
- Growth in demand for Assessment of Need, diverting further resources away from interventions.

The HSE's *Roadmap for Service Improvement 2023 – 2026, Disability Services for Children and Young People*, launched in October 2023, now in implementation phase, is a targeted Service Improvement Programme to achieve a quality, accessible, equitable and timely service for all children with complex needs as a result of a disability and their families.

The Roadmap, includes a robust suite of 60 actions, including 21 on CDNT Retention and Recruitment targets, and



many of which are now in train.

### National Information Management System for the CDNTs (CDNTIMS)

Historically the number of children waitlisted for children's disability services provided by section 38 and section 39 providers has not been available nationally. The establishment of CDNTs in 2021 has facilitated the collection of this data. A National Management Information System for all 91 CDNTs is being rolled out and when implemented, will provide current data on waiting lists and other details for all CDNTs.


Pending full roll-out, manual data collection is on-going. Information is collated nationally per CHO.

The table below is the most recent data reported to the Business Information Unit (BIU) -end of May 2024. This shows the number of children that are waiting for an initial contact with a CDNT in the 9 CHO Areas. Information pertaining to CHO 6 and CHO 7 is highlighted.

It is important to note that as the CDNTs are a Multidisciplinary service, information is not collated for individual disciplines/services.
