The Health Service Executive (HSE) National Ambulance Service (NAS) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Questions, which you submitted to the Minister for response.

The Pre Hospital Emergency Care Council (PHECC) <u>https://www.phecit.ie/</u> is the statutory regulator of pre hospital emergency care in Ireland. In this regard, Training and Education Standards, as well as Clinical Practice Guidelines (CPG) which determine practitioner scope of practice, are approved by PHECC.

NAS ensures that the latest version of all new CPGs are included in the education of Student Paramedics and the professional development of existing staff.
