Dear Deputy Shanahan,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

The Capital Works Management Framework (CWMF) is a structure that has been developed to deliver the Government's objectives in relation to public sector construction procurement. It consists of a suite of best practice guidance, standard contracts and generic template documents that form the four pillars that support the Framework, as shown below.

- Pillar 1 Public Works Standard Forms of Construction Contract
- Pillar 2 Standard Conditions of Engagement for Consultants Appointment
- Pillar 3 Cost Planning & Control, Suitability Assessment Questionnaires
- Pillar 4 Guidance Notes and Glossary



Public Sector Contracting Authorities delivering Capital infrastructure development works are obliged to use the Capital Works Management Framework when procuring infrastructural works.
