The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (PQ 20110/24) which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

The HSE Community Audiology workforce data for March 2024 is outlined in Table 1 by CHO, along with their respective populations and workforce ratio per 100k/population.

The HSE stated objective is to ensure that citizens can access the right care, at the right time and in the right place. The geographic catchment areas for Primary Care Teams are defined nationally by Community Healthcare Organisation (CHO) are based on population figures. In relation to catchment areas CHO's track waiting lists on a continuous basis and ensure they prioritise the provision of care for those patients identified as having the greatest needs and the highest risk within their overall resource.

In 2023, a total of 56,322 Audiology patients were seen which is an increase of 5.7% compared to 2022. In the first quarter of 2024, a total of 13,733 Audiology patients were seen.
