The HSE does not provide funding to individual service users for the procurement of powered mobility equipment. These and other types of equipment are provided based on an assessed clinical need. Aspects considered in the provision of powered mobility equipment include a risk assessment, and impact on the service user's quality of life. These items, once approved, are procured by the HSE and provided to the individual.
