Dear Deputy Kerrane,

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question (PQ 38745/24) which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

The HSE audiology service provides help with hearing loss for children and adults. The audiology service is free for all children under 18 and eligible adults in Ireland. As of 1<sup>st</sup> August 2023, to 1<sup>st</sup> August 2024 - 21,357 new patients were referred to the Community Audiology Services in the same period, 49,272 patients have received treatment.

The HSE currently provides appointments for residents of nursing homes in the relevant Community Audiology services when referred by their GP, this ensures assessments are performed in high quality sound booths. Treatment is carried out according to clinical priority and availability of resources.

I trust this is of assistance.
