To ask the Minister for Health to outline the range of services provided at Arklow Primary Care Centre, Arklow, County Wicklow; the proposals, if any, to expand the range of services available; and if she will make a statement on the matter.

Dear Deputy Byrne,

The Health Service Executive has received your query on behalf of the constituents of Arklow in relation to services provided in Arklow Primary Care Centre. I can confirm the following services are provided:

- Public Health Nursing Services
- Physiotherapy Services
- Occupational Therapy Service
- Speech & Language Therapy Services
- Psychology Services
- Dental Services
- Counselling in Primary Care (CIPC)
- Smoking Cessation Clinics
- National Maternity Hospital Antenatal Outreach Clinic
- GP Out of Hour services
- Community Intervention Team
- Radiology / Diagnostic Services (XRy and Ultrasound)
- Mental Health Services.
- Arklow Community Mental Health Team
- General Practitioner practice - Maryville Surgery, an established practice with four GPs
- Psychiatry of Old Age outreach services
- Rehab and Recovery Mental Health outreach services
- Intellectual Disability outreach services
- Diabetic Retina Screen Programme on behalf of the National Screening Service will be offered to eligible clients within the catchment area.



- HSE Addiction auxiliary health care services consisting of Youth Drug and Alcohol Services (YoDA), Counselling, Rehab Services and Outreach Harm Reduction provides a daily service and operates inclusively as key components of a comprehensive OST (Opioid Substitution Treatment) clinic on site in Arklow PCC for service users. Youth Drug and Alcohol Services (YoDA) are a specialised under 18 service, which deliver service supports to the Arklow region and operate from the OST clinic area at Arklow PCC.
- Children's Disability Network Team – (CDNT) provide supports and services for children/young people and their families from birth to 18 years with complex disabilities. The team have dedicated spaces for meetings and intervention sessions with families and children from an interdisciplinary team.
