## **Abbreviations – UK Terms**

ch	chain
dc	double crochet
htr	half treble
tr	treble crochet
dtr	double treble crochet
sl	slip stitch
rnd	round
sts	Stitches

#### **Instructions – UK Terms**

Start with a magic circle

**Rnd 1** ch2, 7htr, join with sl to top of first chain. Pull the circle tight. (8 sts)





Rnd 2 ch2, htr in first st, 2htr in next 2 sts, 2dc in next st, sl, 2htr in next 3 sts, join with sl to top of chain. (16 sts)



Rnd 3 ch2, htr in first st, 3dc, (htr, tr) in next st, 6dtr in next st, sl 2 sts, 6dtr in next st, (tr, htr) in next st, 3dc, htr, tr, join with sl to top of chain. (28 sts)



Rnd 4 ch1, 5dc, 2htr into the next 2 sts, 2tr in next 4 sts, htr, sl across previous 2 sl, htr, 2tr in next 4 sts, 2htr, 5dc, (htr, tr in next st, (tr, htr) in next st, join with sl to first ch1 st. (38 sts)

Cut yarn

chain

#### **Instructions – US Terms**

#### Start with a magic circle

**Rnd 1** ch2, 7hdc, join with sl to top of first chain. Pull the circle tight. (8 sts)





Rnd 2 ch2, hdc in first st, 2hdc in next 2 sts, 2 tr in next st, sl, 2hdc in next 3 sts, join with sl to top of chain. (16 sts)



Rnd 3 ch2, hdc in first st, 3 sc, (hdc, dc) in next st, 6tr in next st, sl 2 sts, 6tr in next st, (dc, hdc) in next st, 3 sc, hdc, tdc, join with sl to top of chain. (28sts)



Rnd 4 ch1, 5sc, 2hdc, 2dc in next 4 sts, hdc, sl across previous 2 sl, hdc, 2dc in next 4 sts, 2 hdc, 5sc, (hdc, dc in next st, (dc, hdc) in next st, join with sl to first ch1 st. (38sts)

Cut yarn

### **Finishing**

Once you have your two pairs of heart place them together with the right sides facing outwards. That is place the smoother centres together. Join using dc/sc through both hearts stitches. Dc/sc around the edge.

**Specification** 

The colour yarn used for the hearts is purple which is the colour of the end-of-life symbol, it is associated with nobility, solemnity and spirituality. The end-of-life symbol indicates that a person is dying or has died and appears on a number of end-of-life care resources currently in use in the hospital.



\* King Cole double knitting wool was used in the crochet hearts in the picture but it is not a necessity to use this wool. Hearts in any shade of purple are accepted for this initiative.
