Covid-19 Vaccination Programme Update for General Practice

April 2024

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► Introduction

The COVID-19 vaccination programmes have now transitioned to an Autumn/Winter Vaccination Campaign and a Spring Campaign, in line with National Immunisation Advisory Committee (NIAC) guidance.

Campaign Commencement

- It has been confirmed that the Spring booster campaign commences on 22nd April 2024 and will continue until 31st May 2024.
- It is recognised that in some cases, given the timeframe, vaccinations may run into June.
- Ideally all Spring boosters should be completed by 14th June 2024, this will then allow for a sufficient interval period to elapse, to enable those vaccinated to receive their autumn booster.
- HSE will be launching a public information campaign from 19th of April 2024.

F > Eligible Cohorts

- The groups recommended for a COVID-19 spring booster:
 - those aged 80 years and older.
 - those living in long term care facilities for older adults.
 - those aged 5 years and older with immunocompromise associated with a suboptimal response to vaccination.

NIAC also recommend that the spring booster should be made available for those aged 70-79 years who, following discussion with a healthcare provider, request vaccination.

F > Types of Vaccines

Comirnaty XBB.1.5

- Comirnaty® XBB.1.5 is the preferred vaccine for the spring campaign including primary doses and additional doses.
- The schedule of primary doses for healthy individuals and those with immunocompromise has been updated in the latest NIAC guidance.
- The IT System is updated to enable Comirnaty® XBB.1.5
 - Dose 1- single dose for healthy individuals.
 - Dose 2 and Additional doses- for those with immunocompromise will also be facilitated in the systems.

> Ordering & Delivery Schedule

Ordering

- The ordering of COVID-19 stock will continue through National Cold Chain Services (NCCS) and the online portal www.ordervaccines.ie
- The delivery schedule is a fortnightly cycle with delivery dates identified in the NCCS calendar within the online portal system.

Consumable (Clinical Packs)

Disposable syringes, needles and pre injection alcohol swabs can be requested through the online portal.

- Tick the "YES" box on the Cold Chain vaccine order platform to receive packs in line with your order volume.
- If sufficient packs are available in your site, tick the "NO" box and none will be delivered.

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Direct to Citizen Communications

- Targeted SMS messages to citizens to signpost vaccination options from 24 April
- SMS to eligible cohort:
 - Immunocompromised 12+ years
 - 80+ years
- Communications planned:
 - 5-11 year olds who are IC: Direct calls to parents/guardians

► ► HSE Vaccination Teams

For the Spring campaign, HSE Vaccination teams will offer the following vaccination services

COVID-19 clinics for:

- Children aged 5-11 with Immunocompromise associated with a suboptimal response to vaccination
- Acute hospital inpatients
- Eligible persons in the custody of the Irish Prison Service
- Residents of Residential Care Facilities (RCFs) for Older Persons
- Areas which are underserved by GP and Pharmacy coverage

Recording of Vaccine Administration

- All COVID-19 vaccinations must be entered on GP Practice Management Systems, this serves as both a clinical record and triggers payment through PCRS.
- Please note that it is essential to record the administration of all COVID-19 vaccines promptly, to ensure that clinical records are kept up to date and two doses are not administered in error.
- Other common data entry errors:
 - Entry of duplicate records
 - Use of Professional Identification Number e.g. MCRN, NMBI please ensure that the vaccinator professional identification number is entered correctly
 - Selection of incorrect vaccine name
 - Incorrect batch number
 - Interval errors
- Systems will be updated to reflect current vaccines only with redundant vaccines being removed periodically. Any
 notifications of vaccine removals will be issued in advance.



COVID-19 Vaccine

• The rate to be paid for vaccinations administered by GP's will remain at €25 per dose.
