

MY HSE SELF SERVICE TO BE ROLLED OUT FURTHER

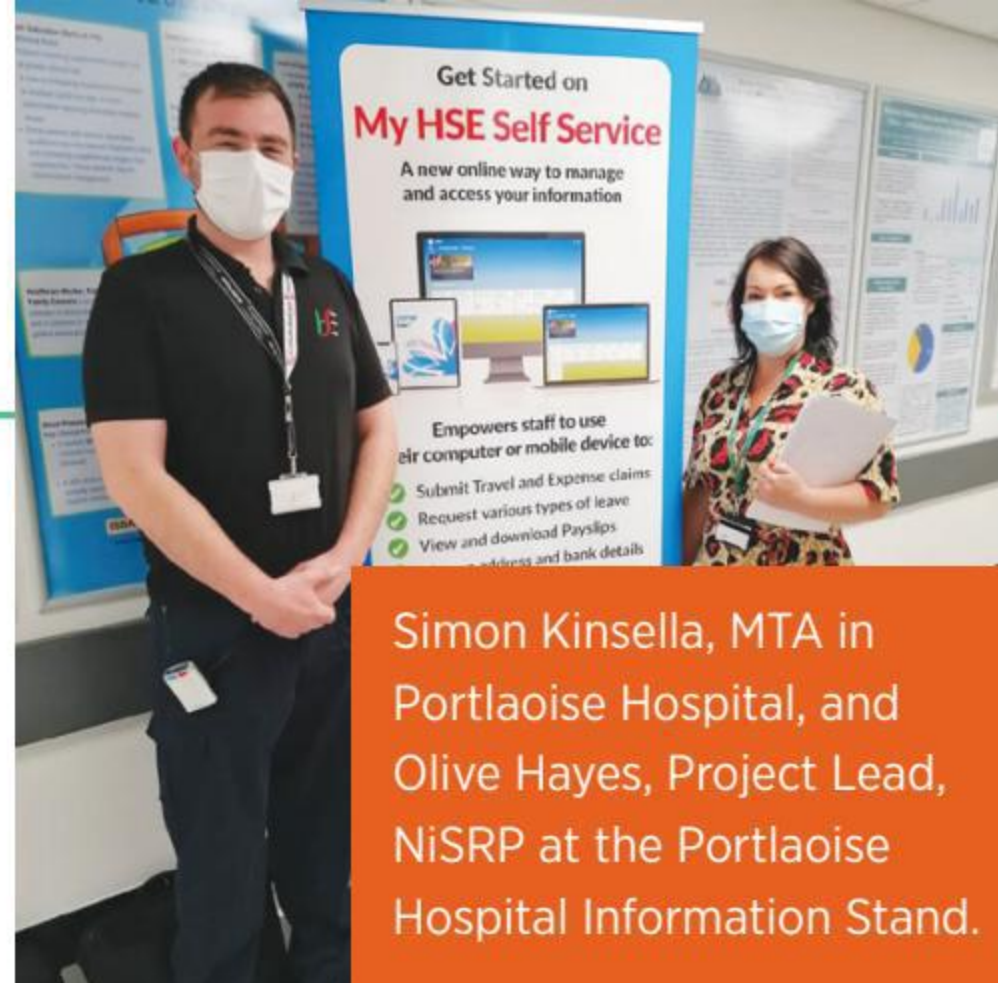
National integrated Staff Records and Pay programme (NiSRP) My HSE Self Service is being made available to all HSE staff in the Midlands, North West and MidWest in the first quarter of 2022.

Since mid-2019, NiSRP has successfully implemented SAP Staff Records, SAP Payroll, SAP time entry and SAP self-service functionality across HSE East and South East, areas which feature more than 30,000 staff and pensioners.

The online facility allows employees to view or change a range of personal information, view their payslip, request leave and submit travel expenses claims, and allows managers to approve applications for leave and travel.

The NiSRP programme encourages all staff in these areas to set up an account for My HSE Self Service.

Create Project 2021 Digital and Assistive Technology Pilot

The HSE Disability Services Department Longford/Westmeath will receive €100,000 from the CREATE 2021 initiative to conduct a focused pilot project to assess and provide Digital and Assistive Technology (DAT) to Adults with disabilities in County Longford.

The Cooperative Real Engagement for Assistive Technology Enhancement (CREATE) initiative seeks to ensure that service users and providers work together to identify what will make a real difference to individual users of digital and assistive technology (DAT).

The aim is to promote digital and assistive

technology to support independent living for up to 10 service users who:

- Live in Longford County Council housing and would benefit from DAT in the home to increase independence.
- Have a housing need, are on the Longford housing waiting list and would benefit from DAT which would support their application for housing.
- Are keen and willing to try DAT to realise their independent living goals.

The HSE will partner with Longford County Council to support persons moving to social housing and assisting those with applications for social housing.

Funding will be available to pilot projects in February/March 2022.

DEDICATED SPECIALIST MENOPAUSE CLINIC OPENS AT NATIONAL MATERNITY HOSPITAL

A new clinic at the National Maternity Hospital (NMH) aims to improve menopause care for women with complex menopausal symptoms.

The specialist Complex Menopause Clinic, supported by funding from the Department of Health and HSE's National Women & Infants Health Programme, is open and seeing patients. The service is dedicated to helping patients with serious medical conditions to manage their menopausal symptoms.

The clinic is the first of four publicly funded specialist menopause clinics in Ireland and is staffed by GP menopause specialists,

a full-time nurse specialist and an administrative team.

Mary Brosnan, Director of Midwifery and Nursing at the NMH said, "This is a great stride forward for women's health. We are delighted to have this dedicated, specialist clinic at The NMH. As a woman, a midwife and nurse, I am acutely aware of how challenging the symptoms of menopause can be and of the life-changing benefits evidence-based treatment can give."

Initially, the clinic will care for patients living in counties Dublin, Wicklow and

Kildare with the intention of expanding to include Ireland East in the near future. The first of an intended four publicly funded specialist Menopause Clinics. It is planned that a further three specialist clinics will be approved, funded and developed in 2022.
