
The Patient Safety Act was signed into law by the President on 02 May 2023 – the commencement date for the Act has not yet been confirmed by the Department of Health but it may be as soon as September of this year (Access the Act here.)

As part of the HSE's preparation for the commencement of the 2023 Act, work of the HSE Patient Safety Act Implementation Working Group is ongoing. Some of the key pieces of work underway are:

- The delivery of a Notifiable Incident reporting form on NIMS, in collaboration with the DOH, HIQA, MHC and the State Claims Agency;
- The development of an e-learning programme on the Act to support all health and social care staff with implementation, and
- The updating of guidance documents, resources and policies.



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

will open imminently!

The National Incident Management System (NIMS) and Open Disclosure updates:

- 1) Staff will be able to record if open disclosure took place at the time of reporting the incident on the electronic NIMS record, including the date.
- 2) Staff will be able to log if the open disclosure meeting has taken place; whether this has been followed-up in writing, and whether the review report was shared for Category 1 and Category 2 patient safety incidents and notifiable incidents described in the Patient Safety Act.
- 3)The functionality has been built to report notifiable incidents to the relevant regulator using NIMS. Private providers will report via a portal on the relevant regulator's website page.

We are very grateful for all our HSE colleagues who have tested the updates and provided invaluable feedback. We are in the final stages of this project and await commencement of the Act for these changes to go live. Thank you!
