
To ask the Minister for Health if his Department or the HSE collate statistics on the number, or suspected number, of persons addicted to drugs or alcohol; if so, if that number has risen or fallen over the past decade; and if he will provide statistics, in tabular form.

Dear Deputy Tóibín,

The Health Service Executive have been requested to reply directly to your above Parliamentary Question which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response.

The HSE collates information on treatment episodes, and KPIs associated with this treatment, however, does not collate population-based statistics on the number/estimated number of 'persons addiction to drugs or alcohol'.

Regarding HSE Opioid Agonist Treatment (OAT) data, this has increased by 26% since 2009. In 2023 a total of 11,442 people received OAT. The numbers treated have remained relatively stable in recent years with a 0.7% increase since 2020 (Figure 1).
