1. What Housing First is

Unconditional access to permanent housing with wraparound health supports. Housing First adheres to seven key principles,

Housing First is housing those with histories of long term homelessness and complex health needs, including physical health.

2. Context

According to the National Housing First Implementation Evaluation, 70% of people have reported two or more physical health conditions and nearly 24% reported having at least 6 health conditions. 60% reported having received at least one head injury.

The mortality of people experiencing homelessness is very high, <u>42 years or younger for men and 36.5</u> years or younger.

6. Supporting the approaches

Housing First uses three key approaches: 1. Trauma informed care (access training on HSELand "Becoming Trauma Aware - An Introduction to Psychological Trauma"

- 2. Strengths based practice
- 3. Harm reduction

First and your role

Health professionals have a vital role in supporting Housing First residents at different points in their journey. Key activities may include:

- Facilitating a referral for a health assessments and taking a flexible approach to the assessment and appointments
- Supporting residents to access mainstream health services
- Working closely with the Housing First team, sharing information and attending multi-agency meetings
- Offering vaccinations, screenings, and health education to promote long-term well-being
