#### 1. What Housing First is

Unconditional access to permanent housing with wraparound health supports. Housing First adheres to seven key <u>principles</u>, watch video here to learn more.

Housing First is housing those with histories of long term homelessness and complex health needs, including mental health.

#### 2. Context

Housing First residents have very high levels of anxiety and depression and almost two-thirds (65%) reported having at least one significant mental health problem.

The most frequently reported were psychotic disorders and unipolar

Housing First is successfully housing individuals with complex health needs who have spent significant portions of their lives homeless on society's margins.

Housing First uses three key approaches:

- 1. Trauma informed care (access training on HSELand "<u>Becoming Trauma Aware An Introduction to Psychological Trauma</u>"
- 2. Strengths based practice
- 3. Harm reduction

Mental health teams have a vital role in supporting Housing First residents at different points in their journey. Key activities may

- Facilitating a referral for a mental health assessment and taking a flexible approach to the assessment and appointments
- Supporting residents to access counselling and medication, taking into account <u>dual diagnosis</u> and working alongside your local Drug and Alcohol service
- Working closely with the Housing First team, sharing information and attending multi-agency meetings
- Providing MH outreach
