Elm Mount Unit Approved Centre

Elm Mount Unit is an approved centre situated in St. Vincent's University Hospital, Elm Park, Dublin 4. The unit is a partnership venture between the Health Service Executive (HSE) and the St. Vincent's Healthcare Group. The approved centre, which opened in 2005, provides mental health in-patient treatment and care to people living in the Community Healthcare Organisation (CHO) 6, namely the Dublin South East area. It is divided into three areas: Elm Mount distinct Upper, located on the ground floor level; Elm Mount Lower, and; the specialist Psychiatry of Old Age unit. Elm Mount Upper is an acute admission unit that comprises of single and shared rooms for both male and female residents. The specialist Psychiatry of Old Age (POA) unit is located adjacent to Elm Mount Upper and is comprised of single and double bedrooms. Elm Mount Lower is a step down/sub-acute unit which also has beds allocated to the eating disorders team.

Le Brun & Whitethorn House Approved Centre

The approved centre is located within the grounds of Clonskeagh Hospital, near the south Dublin village of Ranelagh. It consists of Whitethorn House, which provides for the continuing care of adults with enduring mental health needs under the Rehabilitation and Recovery team, and Le Brun House, a specialist mental health service for people over the age of 65 under the Psychiatry of Older Adults (POA) team.

Avonmore and Glencree Units, Newcastle Hospital Approved Centre

Avonmore and Glencree Units are located on the outskirts of Newtownmountkennedy, Co. Wicklow. Glencree Ward is an acute admissions unit and the Avonmore Ward is a continuing care and long stay facility that provides assessment and treatment for residents aged over 65 years. Several general adult sector teams and specialist teams (Psychiatry of Old Age, Rehabilitation and Recovery Psychiatry, and Mental Health Intellectual Disability) admit to the approved centre.
