St Ita's Ward, Louth Meath Mental Health Service (LMMHS) is committed to best professional, legal, ethical and safe practice in the management of residents who pose an imminent risk of severe harm to self and/or others and will only consider the use of physical restraint when all other alternative interventions have been exhausted.

St Ita's Ward is committed to respecting the right of the person to dignity, bodily integrity, privacy and autonomy during the management of physical restraint, whilst taking into consideration the level of resident's clinical risk and safety.

A statement about the compliance with the approved centre's own reduction policy

St Ita's Ward is compliant in its implementation of using a no hands first approach during the management of complex behaviours.

As part of St Ita's Ward physical restraint reduction strategy the following initiatives are in place/ to be implemented:

- 1) Monthly data in relation to incidences, trends of physical restraint
- 2) A proactive approach to the assessment, identification and understanding of risk behaviours by gathering pertinent data through the use of assessment tools such as:

- Risk Assessments
- Life Story
- Activities Assessment & Activity Plan



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- 3) Communication of learning from post incident reviews and debriefings following incidents of physical restraint through St Ita's Ward Clinical Governance Committee in order to inform practice and identify alternative strategies to physical restraint.
- 4) Mandatory training for all grades of staff and disciplines working in St Ita's in Professional Management of Challenging Behaviour.
- 5) Comprehensive induction for all new staff to St Ita's Ward.
- 6) Implementation of 'Safe Ward' initiative - a proactive active approach to care with the aim of reducing incidences of violence and aggression.
