Dear Dr Colleagues,

You will have received the updated Code of Practice from Irish Dental Council which states

Amending EU Regulation 2024/1849

This regulation aims to end the use of dental amalgam in dentistry except in limited circumstances. From 1 January 2025 dental amalgam will be prohibited for use in the EU, except when deemed strictly necessary by the dentist based on the specific medical needs of the patient.

The export of dental amalgam is prohibited from 1 January 2025 and the import and manufacture of dental amalgam is prohibited from 1 January 2026. The import and manufacturing of dental amalgam will be allowed beyond that date where it is imported/manufactured to meet these specific medical needs.

As the DTSS is a publically funded dental treatment scheme, appropriate arrangements must be in place within the DTSS to demonstrate compliance with this legal requirement.

With effect from 1st January 2025 dentists who claim for an A3A Amalgam Restoration will be asked to tick a box which states '*I confirm treatment provided is in compliance with EU directive 2017/852 and amendment 2024/1849 relating to Dental Amalgam*'. The contractor will also be asked to provide a clinical necessity on the DTSS form to indicate the specific medical needs which justify the use of amalgam.
